Question: S106 income, is this high or average?

Answer: Chair confirmed income received from \$106 is dependent on development within the Parish and this year was higher than usual due to large development off Impington Lane.

Abbey Fields - Jon Pavey

Slideshow shared with all, highlighting:

- Brought by the community for the community to protect wildlife and provide open space
- Local Green Space designation
- Croft Close set aside is an important Natural Habitat with many rare species
- 220 individuals have donated
- Opportunity for hands on learning with Impington Village College
- A place for the Community to provide calmness, walks, jogging
- Regular maintenance working parties

Histon and Impington Pump Track - Dan Clifton

- Opportunity for a tick box for many wheeled sports, not just skateboards
- Safe place for young people of all ages
- Difficult to vandalise compared to a skate park
- Community group being formalised and public meeting planned
- Data to support reduction in anti-social behaviour
- Facility of the generation
- Plans to explore hire/taster day for the community
- Interest noted from uniformed groups
- Exploring potential village location, no site identified to date

Community Land Trust – Lisette Veit

- Housing need in the villages recognised noting most houses unaffordable to young people
- Interest in former Infant School site as a village medical centre
- Aspirations to meet the needs of residents
- Exploring bringing 'Maker Space' to the villages

7 OPEN FORUM

Question: Closing balance is high – why is that?

Answer: includes Section 106 funds, Parish Council does have plans to spend and the Auditor does politely advise when balance is high

Question: Park Primary School – are their any plans for parking to the rear of the school? Answer: County Council owns the entire site, no plans have been shared to indicate parking provision

Question: 20 is Plenty Campaign, will the new Parish Council support this?

Answer: a question for the new Council to take forward and explore further. County Council driven campaign expected later in the year

Question: following the development on the High Street, the addition of Stir has created further parking problems on School Hill/Park Lane. Need for double lines

Answer: Parish Council are looking to extend double yellow lines as part of Local Highways Initiative application for implementation September 2022

Question: What are the plans for replacing the Pat Fleet Memorial Garden?

Answer: HI Hub seeking volunteers to take this forward. Denis Payne actioned to explore this further and progress plans

Question: Public Art in the Parishes, is there a plan for more?

Answer: currently 25 pieces of art in the villages included in a trail, Parish Council would welcome ideas for further pieces.

Question: What about painting the B1049 bridge? Answer: Parish Council can explore options
